

About The Artist Michael Menchaca

Michael Menchaca's evolution as an artist began with his enrollment at San Antonio Community College (SAC) where he majored in Graphic Design. Menchaca had enrolled at San Antonio College with the thought of a career in graphic marketing and advertising.

Mel Casas, the brilliant art professor at SAC, had passed away when Menchaca arrived on campus, but fortunately for the young artist, numerous art professors, including fine arts teacher Mark Pritchett, stepped up to help him expand his artistic range. Pritchett's mentoring led Menchaca to explore creativity beyond graphic designing.

Upon receiving an Associate Degree from SAC, Menchaca enrolled at Texas State University with the intent of studying printmaking. At the San Marcos campus he also developed a greater interest in his Mexican American roots. Over time, he also developed an interest in pre-Columbian Mexican figures incorporated from the Aztec and Mayan codices.

Menchaca's work celebrates his memories, his Latino heritage, and his vision of San Antonio. His art also

connect us with history, folklore, and popular culture. Menchaca is a gifted graphic artist and printer and considers his work a reflection of his upbringing, his home, his city

and his family. It is for him a personal story including nostalgic memories.

Menchaca's artistic inspiration comes from many sources, but the visual narratives of artist Carmen Lomas Garza caught his eye early in his career. It should be noted that Garza also introduces folkloric interpretation in her work.

Menchaca's signature motif is a mustachioed cat that represents the artist and his Latino community. He chose a cat icon for many reasons, but he was particularly influenced by popular culture.

Growing up with television cartoons and video games, cats named Sylvester, Heathcliff and Garfield entertained him. He believed that the cat motif "could open the doors," in his words, for him to explore his cultural heritage, racial tensions, and stories of immigration. The cat motif would dominate most of his future printed visual interpretations. Menchaca also seeks to bridge the modern with the ancient. Mass media and popular culture influenced his modern cat character, as did the real life cats that invaded his family backyard when he was growing up.

With the addition in recent years of preColumbian images to his prints and collages, Menchaca pays tribute to his Mestizo heritage. Many of these figures, often featured

with ancient masks, are an inspiration from Aztec and Mayan codices. These figures appear in all of Menchaca's collage works.

In 2012, Menchaca was one of the youngest artists chosen for the McNay's "Estampas de la Raza" exhibit. The following year, the "State of the Art" Exhibition at new Crystal Bridges Museum of Art in Arkansas featured his work among 102 American artists giving him national recognition. Menchaca has matured as an artist in a relatively short time and his creativity adds an exciting component to Latino art.

He is currently participating in an exhibition with Lawndale Art Center in Houston called The Codex Silex Vallis (The Silicon Valley Codex). Menchaca visualizes how the growing tech industry—largely based out of Silicon Valley—is infiltrating traditional Latinx family customs in the United States. In large scale, Menchaca explores the imagery and themes from his eponymously-titled series through a variety of media, including a site-specific wallpaper installation, new paintings, drawings, screen and digital print, videos, and virtual reality.

Menchaca was tasked with creating works that commemorate the legacy and assets of both Kelly and Brooks and how they are tied to the San Antonio community. Menchaca's work illustrates the emergence of Port San Antonio as a large and dynamic technology and innovation campus.

"It was a huge honor to create works that commemorate both of

the extraordinary legacies that Kelly and Brooks bases hold within the San Antonio community," said Menchaca. "The challenge for me was in visualizing a simultaneous narrative that spoke to the history of service by, and for the community, while intermixing the culture of today." Menchaca developed original designs that describe the distinctive architecture of each military base, showcasing their unique features while also highlighting their significant historic events. Reverential portrayals of service members, in the style of Menchaca's unique digital codex characters, reflect the demographics of San Antonio's military service members.

La NCAA aprobó una decisión histórica que afecta a los atletas universitarios de todo el país. Los atletas universitarios podrán beneficiarse de su nombre, imagen y semejanza. La NCAA declaró en un comunicado de prensa el martes que quieren asegurarse de que los estudiantes atletas tengan las mismas oportunidades de ganar dinero como sus otros compañeros estudiantes, manteniendo las prioridades de educación y la experiencia universitaria.

El miembro de la junta declaró a la prensa: "La flexibilidad adicional en esta área puede y debe continuar apoyando los deportes universitarios como parte de la educación superior. Esta modernización para el futuro es una extensión natural de los numero-

sos pasos que los miembros de la NCAA han tomado en los últimos años para mejorar el apoyo a los estudiantes atletas, incluido el costo total de asistencia y las becas garantizadas".

WEX Foundation Wins First Place at International Congress Space Exploration

Last month, WEX Foundation's founder Sam Ximenes accepted the first place award for the Interactive Poster presentation at the 70th International Astronautical Congress (IAC) in Washington DC. The poster is titled "From Dust to Gas: LEAP2 Technologies for Lunar Site Development at the Marius Hills Skylight".

Ximenes placed first among presenters from Norway, Japan and Sweden, emphasizing the work of San Antonio's own Space community. The presentation discussed Collaborative research projects with the WEX Foundation and Exploration Architecture Corp (XArc).

The IAC is the largest annual gathering of the global space community of international government space

agencies, industry, and academia. The Interactive Poster can be viewed at this link: "From Dust to Gas: LEAP2 Technologies for Lunar Site Development at the Marius Hills Skylight". (Warning it is about a 15 minute read if you view all the various videos that are included.)

The poster highlights the consortium approach to the research projects focused on site development of the Marius Hills Skylight lava tube caves explored in the LEAP2 program. The WEXF LEAP2 STEM Education program is the educational outreach component of the commercial LEAP2 lunar site development program being developed by an international consortium of aerospace industry organizations. The commercial LEAP2 program is led by

Texas based XArc Exploration Architecture Corporation and addresses space architecture issues in lunar exploration, economic development, mining, and sustainment in a large deep pit on the moon formed from a lava tube ceiling collapse.

The entrance to a lava tube cave is indicated by a large overhang at the pit's northeast side. Mineral resources in the surrounding area have been postulated for surface mining. The potential for long term habitation and settlement within the protection of the lava tube form the basis for the economic development of the site.

The WEX Foundation (WEXF) was established to promote, encourage and support the convergence of technology and education as applied to new visions for human space exploration and its long-term implications for the educational development of the nation's next generation of scientists, engineers, mathematicians and technologists, beginning with K-12 education. Its focus is to promote science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) education for K-12 curriculum development; improving STEM teaching and student comprehension in school districts and areas where students have been traditionally under-served and under-represented in institutions of higher education; to prepare and encourage low-income, first-generation college-bound students and students with disabilities to pursue higher education and careers in human space exploration.

The goal is to foster an education path for special needs students and historically under-represented constituents into the aerospace community with the development of curriculum lesson and activity plans with the latest information available in space science and space exploration with a focus on space exploration goals to inform students about STEM careers. WEXF objectives include providing the student with the latest information on the universe, manned and unmanned space exploration, advances in space technology and help special needs students and Hispanic students in low-income school districts to understand the concepts surrounding spaceflight, space vehicles, launch systems, space operations, and space missions as well as the history of astronomy and the study of the Earth, the Sun, the Moon, the Solar System, and the terrestrial and outer planets.

The foundation will serve diverse populations in fulfilling its purposes, and participate in activities reasonably necessary to carry out such purposes.







According to the 2016 US Census, San Antonio has a higher than national average of people without health insurance - 19% versus 10%. EnrollSA, a coalition comprised of medical stakeholders and grass roots entities, was formed in 2013 by current Presidential candidate and former San Antonio mayor Julián Castro and Judge Nelson Wolff to help address this gap and efficiently enroll as many people as possible for medical care.

Since San Antonio also has a higher than national poverty rate (19% versus 12%), many may qualify for programs that can help reduce costs. “If they fall between 100-400% of the federal poverty level, there are programs that can help pay for monthly premiums, the deductibles and total out of pocket costs,” says José A. Ibarra, CentroMed Certified Application Counselor and EnrollSA Co-Chair. Individuals may also qualify for subsidies to help lower the cost of medical insurance depending on income and family size. The Health Insurance Marketplace Calculator is available on the EnrollSA website to give you an insight into what you might be expected to pay. Some may even pay little to no cost.


Open enrollment at EnrollSA begins for those who do

not have employer-provided healthcare and/or are not seeking to Enroll or Renew Medicare on November 1st and ends December 15th. If you do not enroll for a healthcare plan by December 15th, you will be unable to get 2020 medical coverage unless you qualify for a Special Enrollment Period (SEP). Healthcare.gov describes SEP’s as specific life events, “including losing health coverage, moving, getting married, having a baby, or adopting a child. If you qualify for an SEP, you usually have up to 60 days following the event to enroll in a plan.” Healthcare plans

take effect January 1, 2020.

Urging community members not to wait to seek assistance, Ibarra said, “Services are 100% free. If someone is charging, get away from them.” EnrollSA representatives are available to help answer qualifying questions and enroll you on the spot for medical insurance required by federal law.

Mexican American D

The Port San Antonio, with nearly 14,000 workers in more than 80 private and public-sector companies today, came about with the closure of Kelly Air Force Base in 1995. Over the past twenty years the Port has evolved as a \$5 billion contributor to the regional economy annually. The transformation of Kelly Air Force Base and how it boosted San Antonio's economic development is the subject of this story. Kelly had its beginning in 1917 when the United States entered World War I. Kelly Field was one of thirty-two Air Service training camps created. The base began when military leaders viewed a cotton field west of the city as the ideal place for training pilots to fly. Its isolation and flat terrain made the location perfect for take offs and landings. The ample space

also allowed building aircraft hangars and fuel depots.

San Antonio's large Mexican American community, for many years largely concentrated in the southern and western portion of the city, owes much of its economic stability to the presence of Kelly Air Force Base. The base, located in the western edge of the city, boosted Mexican American employment over a seventy-five year period.

In the postwar (WWII) era, Kelly Field, as it was known, remained for many decades the largest industrial employer in San Antonio, with over 25,000 employees at its peak. Scholars estimate that Mexican Americans represented sixty percent of that workforce. Over its eighty-five year existence, jobs at Kelly made it possible for thousands of Mexican American families to move

into the middle class.

Edward Riojas, a long time employee at the base, told Texas Public Radio in 2011 that Kelly Field offered many opportunities for advancement. He commented: "People like myself who came in with no skills, we got an equal shot at promotions, and we got our promotions. And then our kids would go to school, and they would become lawyers and doctors and Indian chiefs and everything else." All large urban communities in the United States had experienced economic disruptions associated with the Great Depression in the 1930s. Few had poorer neighborhoods than San Antonio. Latinos living in the south and Westside of San Antonio were especially impacted by the lack of jobs and reliance on low paying unskilled work.

With the entry of the Unit-

ed States into World War II in December of 1941, Kelly Field changed the workforce opportunities for the better. In the process, Kelly Field opened up new opportunities for Westsiders to buy homes and send their children to college.

Albert Curtis, author of *Fabulous San Antonio*, wrote of the World War II days when the base "reached a spectacular peak" and stationed 6,000 officers and enlisted men and employed 24,000 civilians, which included 10,000 women.

Eileen Pace, of Texas Public Radio, commented that "over the years, civil service workers in the hangars at Kelly Air Force Base fine-tuned fighter aircraft and giant cargo planes that transported people, tanks, equipment, medical teams, wounded soldiers and supplies for humanitarian missions."

At age 19, Fred Herrera started his career with Kelly Field, got married, and built his own house with the help of his dad. He and his wife lived in the same house in the Westside for the 40 years that Herrera worked at Kelly Field. Herrera, Deputy Chief of the Industrial Systems Engineering Division at Kelly, recalled that at the height of the Vietnam War in 1970, Kelly Field employed 18,000 workers, the majority of them from the Latino communities south and west of the base.

When Kelly Field closed in 2001, it was the oldest per-


manent air base in the United States. More importantly to the Westside, it was its largest employer. For eighty-five years Kelly Air Force Base played a significant role in America's military defense. Often not mentioned is its role in the creation of a middle class Mexican American community in San Antonio. (*Photos Courtesy of the U.S Air Force Photo Archives*)
