# About The Cover Artist Rudy Treviño

Rudy Treviño hails from the border town of Eagle Pass, and moved to San Antonio at age 14 where he graduated from Fox Technical High School several years after Almazán and Esquivel. The budding artist then studied with noted painter Mel Casas (1929-2014) at San Antonio College where he earned his Associate of Arts degree. Treviño later pursued higher education at the University of Texas, Austin, receiving his BFA in 1973, and at the University of Texas, San Antonio, where he earned his MFA in 1976, the first student to do so. Treviño worked at San Antonio's Sidney Lanier High School as an art teacher for twenty-three years, where he supervised an extensive mural program within the high school in the late 1970s. Treviño began showing his work as early as 1964 and was published in one of the first surveys of Mexican-American art, Jacinto Quirarte's 1973 Mexican American Artists. Three years later, the artist participated in the 1976 touring exhibition "Raíces antiguas, visiones nuevas = Ancient Roots, New Visions" produced by Washington, D.C.'s Fondo del Sol, a show that traveled to ten locations and was touted as the "first major exhibition of works by contemporary artists of Hispanic descent from throughout the United States and Puerto Rico." He also received important early recognition when

his work was included in the ground-breaking 1990 national touring exhibition "Chicano Art: Resistance and Affirmation, 1965-1985" (CARA). Bio is an excerpt from the catalogue essay, "Los Maestros de San Antonio" by Dr. Ann Marie Leimer.

On February 13, the Department of Arts & Culture installed two landmark exhibits addressing Chicano arts at its Centro de Artes gallery in Market Square. XicanX: New Visions challenges previous and existing surveys of Chicano and Latino identity-based exhibitions. Los Maestros: Early Explorers of Chicano Identity highlights the contributions of active Chicano artists since the start of San Antonio's Chicano arts movement in the 1960s and 1970s. The exhibitions will be on view through June 28, 2020.

On the second floor of Centro de Artes, Los Maestros: Early Explorers of Chicano Identity focuses on three of the under-represented artists central to the early Chicano arts movement in San Antonio – Jesse Almazán, José Esquivel, and Rudy Treviño. All three artists were members of Con Safo, San Antonio's first Chicano arts collective. This exhibition focuses on their unique contributions and histories as individual artists. This exhibition also marks the first public showing of Jesse Almazán's work since his death in 2002. Jesse's wife, Maggie Almazán, has loaned her collection and archives for the exhibition.



Out of the Chicano civil rights movement of the 1960s and 1970s, a cohort of talented Mexican-American artists emerged in San Antonio, Texas. Excluded from mainstream galleries and museums, these artists began to organize their own groups, exhibitions, and galleries, interweaving their shared artistic aspirations with commentaries on the social movements of the time. Many were employed as com-

mercial artists, graphic designers, and sign painters. However, their passion was for fine art. Together, they opened new doors for one another and for future generations, and entered into an uncharted exploration of Chicano art, politics, and identity.

Centro Cultural Aztlan is the curator of the Los Maestros exhibition. The organization's Executive Director, Malena Gonzalez-Cid, began developing plans for the exhibition in 2018 through a series of interviews with the featured artists.

Centro de Artes Gallery is an institution dedicated to telling the story of the Latino experience in the United States, with a focus on San Antonio and South Texas through local and regional art, history and culture, and dedicated to sharing the transnational experience of Latinos in the United States. In 2018, the City of San Antonio Department of Arts & Culture hosted an open call for exhibitions for Centro de Artes as part of the strategic plan developed for the gallery in collaboration with the community in 2017. XicanX: New Visions and Los Maestros: Early Explorers of Chicano Identity were two of the ten exhibitions selected by the Centro de Artes Committee through the inaugural open call.

El presente aviso está autorizado por el tribunal para informarle sobre un acuerdo de demanda colectiva que podría afectarlo. El juicio alega que la Universidad de Nuevo México no administró los protocolos adecuados de tratamiento a pacientes pediátricos con leucemia linfoblástica aguda tratados en el Hospital o el Centro de Ciencias de la Salud de la Universidad de Nuevo México ("UNM") entre el 1 de enero de 1977 y el 31 de marzo de 1997. El acuerdo cubre a los pacientes con cáncer pediátrico fallecidos hasta el 1 de diciembre de 2019 inclusive.

El Demandado UNM dice que no ha procedido para nada incorrectamente. El Tribunal no ha decidido quién tiene razón porque las partes han aceptado un acuerdo. El Tribunal ha otorgado una aprobación preliminar a este acuerdo. El tribunal tendrá una audiencia para decidir si aprueba el acuerdo en forma definitiva.

**¿Quién está incluido en el acuerdo?** Usted podría ser miembro de la demanda colectiva si es familiar o beneficia-

rio de un paciente con cáncer pediátrico fallecido tras ser diagnosticado con leucemia linfoblástica aguda y después de recibir tratamiento en UNM entre el 1 de enero de 1977

y el 31 de marzo de 1997 y que haya fallecido hasta el 1 de diciembre de 2019 inclusive.

**¿De qué trata el caso?** Esta causa se centra principalmente en el tema de que si los pacientes con cáncer pediátrico tratados por leucemia linfoblástica aguda en UNM entre el 1 de enero de 1977 y el 31 de marzo de 1997 recibieron los cuidados adecuados.

**¿Qué ofrece el acuerdo?** La Universidad de Nuevo México ha aceptado crear un fondo de \$38,050,000.00 que será dividido entre todos los miembros de la demanda colectiva. El Acuerdo de la demanda colectiva, que está disponible en el sitio web indicado abajo, describe todos los detalles del acuerdo propuesto.

Su parte del fondo dependerá del número de reclamos válidos que se presenten en nombre de los miembros elegibles fallecidos de la demanda colectiva, de si un paciente con cáncer pediátrico fallecido tenga más de un beneficiario estatutario con derecho a compensación, de la cantidad total de los gastos administrativos de los reclamos, de impuestos, indemnizaciones por servicio a los Demandantes nombrados en la causa y los gastos y honorarios de los abogados.

### 6 Week Summer Internship Program Begins June 8

### Applications Are Still Being Accepted For This First Job Opportunity

Many kiddos in San Antonio take their first summer jobs at restaurants, grocery stores, car washes, amusement parks and neighborhood pools, but fresh coming to work age students 14-17 can look into some cooler, professional opportunities with the local non profit JOVEN's Leaders of America summer program.

The Leaders of America 6 week summer internship program provides real life professional experience for students to develop competence, confidence and workplace skills in a variety of local professional environments. JOVEN partners with numerous local businesses and nonprofits to place students in a real professional office to explore how a workplace actually operates and what role they can play as an intern.

Students can expect to learn about data entry, documentation filing, community correspondence through phone calls and emails and much more depending on what office they are assigned to.

Students are placed and monitored at assigned work sites and are expected to work 20 hours a week for a six week period. Students are paid a stipend of \$7.25 an hour.

Eligible students are between the ages 14-17 who reside in one of the following Districts: Edgewood , Harlandale, Northside, San Antonio ,South San, Southside and Southwest. Students must not turn 18 between program dates of: June 8, 2020 – July 24, 2020.

Upon acceptance into the pro-

gram, a mandatory unpaid training will be facilitated from June 8 - 10, 2020 where students must be present for those 3 days of orientation in order to participate in the program. The 6 week summer work program begins on June 15, 2020 through July 24, 2020 with no interruptions.

Coordinator for the Leaders of America Program, Dian Rosete said the best part of the program is that in addition to getting a professional experience, students learn financial literacy.

All student participants are required to save 10% of their summer stipend. Upon acceptance into the program the student must submit Direct Deposit Forms for both checking and savings accounts in order to receive their summer stipend. If they do not have a bank account, they will need to open one.

Applicants will participate in an informal virtual interview for consideration into the program. They will discuss their interests and expectations and present themselves in a professional manner.

Workplace assignments are based on proximity so that participants can commute easily if needed. Rosete explained that some workplace assignments will have remote work opportunities while others will still be in person.

Previous summer cohorts included over 100 students, but since not all workplaces are available in normal operations, this summer's cohort will be capped at 90 students.

Students are required to attend bi-weekly peer to peer meet-

ings where they will get further professional development and correspond with other students in the program. Rosete said at the end of the program students will have a resume to take home as they continue on their professional journey.

The Application Packet must be completed by the student and the parent and include the following: Student's Valid Texas ID, Student's Social Security Card, Student's Birth Certificate, Parent's Current CPS/SAWS Bill and Guardianship Court Ordered Paperwork if applicable.

Application ID and Utility Bill must have the same address or the application will not be accepted.

#### About JOVEN

JOVEN-Juvenile Outreach and Vocational Educational Network was introduced in the summer of 1992 through the Benedictine Resource Center in response to the alarming rise of juvenile crime in Bexar County. With the help of Our Lady of the Lake, a \$30,000 dollar seed grant and four staff, JOVEN's founders were able to begin working in the community to fight the growing gang problem. Over time, through collaborative efforts with other

local organizations and churches, JOVEN became a comprehensive agency that included outreach services, counseling, and structured activities for high-risk youth and their families.

JOVEN was incorporated 1995, and in 1996 registered as an independent non-profit minority, community based organization, recognized at the local, state and federal level as an innovative agency combating the problems and everyday issues of children and their families through education and support services. JOVEN'S programs are divided into four main groups: health education, prevention, intervention, and victims' services.

The organization offers counseling to youth and provides educational opportunities in the areas of drugs and alcohol, abstinence from sex and life skills. All programming takes place in a school setting or at one of two agency facilities during after-school and out-of-school time (OST).

JOVEN is a strong supporter of higher learning by administering an after-school program helping kids with homework and providing them with constructive activities designed to increase their interest in education. The summer camp program helps kids to stay active and involved while out of school.

A holistic approach is provided to each of the families they serve by providing information and referrals to help them and their children to live a better quality of life.

On November 10, 2016, JOVEN celebrated its 20 year anniversary as a non-profit organization.

**Dr. France Anne Cordova**

Prior to being named Chief Scientist of NASA, Dr. France Anne Cordova was the head of the Astronomy and Astrophysics Department at Penn State. She earned her B.A from Stanford and a Ph.D in physics from Cal-Tech. Over the years, Cordova has been involved with numerous scientific communities. She worked with the Hubble Space Telescope Advanced Camera Team, was Deputy Group leader of the Space Astronomy and Astrophysics Group at Los Alamos National Laboratory and served as vice president of the American Astronomical Society. Also a member of the President's National Medal of Sciences Committee, Cordova is the first woman and first Hispanic to hold the position as the Administrator's Senior Scientific Advisor for NASA.

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
