



Let's Talk About It

The New Norm

I just received word from my grandson's daycare that children and staff have been testing positive almost every other day. They are required to put out letters notifying parents. The director stated this is our new reality. Do you agree? How are you handling this new reality? Let's talk about it

Yvette Elizabeth: "I don't know what the answer is but it seems like this is what we're faced with. Working in hospice, we are constant in the middle of getting exposed or having Covid. Handling reality is stressful and how this is affecting our lives, socializing, work, our kids, elderly, etc. How many more vaccines will there be until they get this under control?"

Todd Forbes: "I think information is useful- but where I draw the line is adding fear or panic in the message- that's wrong! To most people, this is

not any worse than a cold- but just like the flu, each person needs to treat themselves accordingly- so think back to before 2020. When someone said they had the flu, did you shut down the nation? School? Stores? Fear is far more dangerous than Covid!!!!"

Janie Saravia: "Fear is a paralyzer and a killer designed to destroy us. I know my God and he is still in control."

Veronica Amaro: "I get those daily from my son's school. My daughter works at a daycare and they too have kids that test positive. What do you do? Treat the symptoms! If you have a fever, stay home. Just like any other illness! We need to start using common sense."

Thomas Mc: "Of course, it's good to know! Let's pretend there's no Covid, I would still want to know if the staff is getting strep, flu, or pneumonia.

My daughter went to a day-care where they had a severe respiratory virus outbreak but didn't want to alarm parents. My daughter ended up at the ER days later because she got it and couldn't breathe. To say I was upset is an understatement, because it may have been preventable."

Andy Squire: "I think pediatric Covid cases are more of a threat to their family than the child. Most of their cases are mild but can infect family members that have underlying conditions or of older age. The ones who are most at risk, vaccinated or not."

Chris Castillo: "I really feel at this point, it's not a matter of IF you get the Rona.. it's WHEN you get the Rona. But if you're vaccinated and boosted up, you may not get it as bad. It does seem to be affecting our son's school as well. It has become the "new norm" unfortunately."

Artist Statement

"I am hoping to find a diverse mode of thinking through our current moment in time in order to address identity and social issues in new stimulating and sometimes challenging ways. I like to tell a story with my art about the impact we have on the world around us, and our potential to shape history while we are alive. I detect currents from the past and present and translate these through a filter of cross-cultural observations into sculpture or mixed media art. The NYFA Immigrant Artist Mentoring Program Exhibition – Round 2 is a continuation of the first round of the exhibit, held at Centro de Artes in 2019. Both exhibits were selected as part of the Centro de Artes Call for Exhibitions managed by the Department of Arts & Culture in

collaboration with the San Antonio Arts Commission and its Centro de Artes Committee. Guest curators and San Antonio-based artists Richard "Ricky" Armendariz, Kim Bishop, Luis Valderas, and Guillermmina Zabala organized the exhibit, with the 34 participating artists representing 12 different countries from across the globe, including Argentina, Chile, Czechoslovakia, France, Germany, Iran, Japan, Kenya, and Venezuela, as well as the Mexico-United States border.

NYFA's Immigrant Artist Mentoring Program paired immigrant artists working in all disciplines with artist mentors who provided individualized support for their mentees, guiding them to achieve specific goals and providing them with broader access to urban cultural centers through an exchange of ideas, resources and experiences. Discussions covered grant proposal ideas; how to approach curators, galleries, and presenting opportunities; social media best practices; networking and funding opportunities through arts institutions; and other local resources. Mentors also met regularly with mentees one-on-one to provide the artists with

portfolio feedback, advice on studio and presentation techniques, and to help write and edit artist statements.

"Many of the participating artists have already contributed to the cultural landscape in San Antonio," said Executive Director of NYFA Michael L. Royce. "The Immigrant Artist Mentoring Program expands their ability to contribute, and this exhibition is the cumulation of what they have learned and created throughout the collaborative process."

The exhibition opened Wednesday, January 26, 2022, and runs through July 3, 2022, at the City of San Antonio's Centro de Artes Gallery, located in Historic Market Square at 101 S. Santa Rosa, 78207. The gallery and all exhibit events detailed below are free and open to the public.

Los Spurs dieron bienvenida al español Juancho Hernangómez vs Brooklyn Nets

En el partido número 46 del rol regular en el circuito de la National Basketball Association (NBA) temporada 2021-2022 y partido local número 24 ante el visitante rival Brooklyn Nets.

La franquicia Silver anf and Black dirigida Por el timonel Gregg Popovich, dieron junto 15,068 espectadores en el estadio AT&T Center emotiva bienvenida al delantero español Juancho Hernangómez quién fue transferido Por los Celtas de Boston.

A la vez Spurs y la gerencia general de Spurs Sports and Entertainment (SS&E por cortó), honraron a los jugadores Patty Mills (guardia) y al delantero LaMarcus Aldridge, quiénes Por varios años vistieron el uniforme del pentacampeón Spurs con los números 8 y 12 respectivamente. Y ahora defienden los colores del club Brooklyn Nets.

Mills y Aldridge llegaron a San Antonio tras haber sido compañeros con Portland Trail Blaz-

ers en diferencia de temporadas.

Mills logró ser parte de la alineación de Spurs qué en 2014 capturo su quinto título derrotando al trubuco Miami Heat.

Por consiguiente Aldridge, con su grandioso estilo de juego sé ha tenido qué conformar, con siete elecciones al tradicional partido NBA All Star Game, ahora con Nets forma parte con jugadores de enorme talento qué tienen a la franquicia dirigida por Steve Nash entre los tres puestos de la Conferencia del Este dónde bien sé podran ubicar placidamente para su clasificación a la posttemporada y de ahí sobresalir en la conquista del banderín qué les dará el boleto a disputar la NBA gran final contra la Conferencia del Oeste.

Los Spurs con su capitán y guardia estelar Dejounte Murray, dieron ferrea pelea a los Nets qué finalmente sé impuso con pizarra de 102-117, con cartones en los cuatro períodos de 24 contra 26, 26-25 a su favor. En la segunda mitad Nets guiados por el barbado guardia estelar James Harden, sé impusieron 29-23 y 38-28.

Mills qué jugó en la banca finalizó encestando 9 unidades en 32 minutos de acción y Aldridge desde la banca en 22 minutos aporto 16 puntos con 7 rebotes. Por los de casa Murray sé despacho encestando 25 puntos en 37 minutos de acción seguido por los delanteros Keldon Johnson con 14, el poste Jakob Poelt con 15. El escolta Derrick White con 17, encestando 3 de 7 triples. El guardia suplente prospecto Devin Vassell contribuyo con 9 unidades durante 23:44 minutos de acción. El alero Doug McDermott puso 7 puntos en la pizarra.

Por Nets, el guardia estelar Harden tuvo grande noche anotando 37 puntos, seguido por el escolta Kyrie Irving con 24 con 3 de 6 tiros tras el arco.

Juancho Hernangómez en su debut en 1 minuto y 43 segundos enseñó sus habilidades siendo ovacionado y bienvenido.

Juancho Hernangómez, de 26 años de edad nativo de Madrid Madrid, España, es miembro del seleccionado Nacional. Llega a San Antonio con y grandes aspiraciones de salir adelante en la excelente academia del es-

tratega Gregg Popovich, quién por 25 años sé ha distinguido en la excelente preparación de basquetbolistas qué hoy en día siguen adelante activos y en su retiró del mejor baloncesto del planeta.

Hernangómez con seis años de experiencia en la NBA seguirá portando el número 41 qué ha portado en el baloncesto español, por igual en el equipo Nacional y con Boston. Bienvenido. (Fotos de Franco).



Saving Our Parks: The Case for Brackenridge Park

My favorite park in America, San Antonio's

Brackenridge Park, is highly esteemed in most Latino households for its many amenities, its history, and its long role in bringing people from all over the city together. Today the park faces many challenges in its efforts to continue to offer great natural spaces and entertainment facilities during a time of rapid demographic growth and higher rates of usage.


Indigenous tribes settled in the surrounding area of the San Antonio River headwaters near the park 12,000 years ago. When the Spanish arrived in 1718 they utilized the tribes of the area for the construction of the water ditches and the Alamo Mission. The acequias they built were essential for the planting of agricultural fields that fed the livestock and provided food for Spanish and Indian residents of the newly constructed Alamo Mission. Brackenridge Park's green space and watershed have important historical significance in San Antonio's early history.

American parks have been a part of the modern urban landscape since the mid 19th century. New York City set the standard with the construction of Central Park in 1858. Many American cities sought to replicate in a smaller fashion the concept of a Central Park. George Brackenridge's donation of a 320 parcel of land to the city of San Antonio nearly 125 years ago was inspired by the urban park planning and remains the most generous land gift in the city's 300-year history.

My mom, Alicia Saenz Romo, took me to

Brackenridge Park one day in 1945. Someone took a photo of us that day which I am fortunate my parents saved. The photo shows me as a young toddler as I walked around part of the park clinging to my older brother who held mom's hand.

During my high school and college running days, I often trained at the

park. The park appealed to me and other runners because it offered off-the-road trails saving runners' worries about traffic interference. The park also offered ample shade from its tall oak and pecan trees. On a hot Texas summer afternoon, the park's shade made a great difference in my one-hour training runs.

Depending on the time of day, I ran by folks in the park cooking lunch or dinner on the barbecue grills along the riverfront, or I jogged behind bike riders peddling down the paved streets that ran through the park. Most often there were children feeding the ducks along the river or playing a game of softball on the park's ball diamonds.

For recreational purposes, I returned on the weekends to ride horses or try my hand at fishing. I was surrounded by families from all over the city who celebrated birthdays and special events at the park, many at the Joske Pavillon.

On my training runs, I was often joined by two Black athletes, twin brothers Charlie and Madison Grant from the Eastside. At that time much of San Antonio was segregated, most notably in housing and hospitality. The Grant brothers attended a segregated Catholic school in the Eastside while I attended a largely Mexican school downtown. Finding a friendly and safe place to run was important in those years—sadly thugs once threatened

our lives as we ran one evening at Woodlawn Park.

Brackenridge Park's inclusiveness over the 20th century lessened the stigma of discrimination and allowed the integration of diverse racial and ethnic groups. Before World War II, most Mexican Americans lived in segregated

communities east and west of downtown. For the entire century, Brackenridge Park welcomed San Antonians of all colors and creeds. At least until the 1960s when public swimming pools became more prevalent, Mexican Americans swam in Brackenridge's section of the San Antonio River. Lambert Beach near the Iron Auto

Bridge was especially popular with Mexican Americans.

An event that gained fame over the last 50 years has been the annual Easter weekend campout at Brackenridge Park. Easter weekend in the park was the busiest of the year with nearly every space near the river and adjacent to the picnic tables occupied. On one occasion when I photographed this special weekend some ten years ago, I met family members who had arrived at the park four to seven days early to reserve their camp space.

These days, with my running days long behind me, I take brisk walks around the park as often as I can. On most weekends, the park is one of

the more popular places for families in San Antonio with children. The amenities of the park include picnic tables, barbecue pits, walking trails, and train rides. The San Antonio Zoo, the Witte Museum, the Japanese Sunken Gardens, and the Sunken Garden Amphitheater are also located within the confines of the original park designation.

Children love the park because it offers ample grounds to run and ride bikes safely. The park offers many benefits for adults as well. An important study conducted by several Scottish researchers found that parks contributed to community well-being. The authors, who examined nearly 500 studies published over the past ten years, concluded that the benefits of parks were substantial. Their key findings revealed that “Physical health, mental wellbeing, and life satisfaction are all enhanced through access to and use of parks and green spaces.” The researchers also found that “parks create important opportunities for social integration.”

Dr. Kathleen L. Wolf, a nature scholar, noted that 40 years of research has demonstrated sufficiently that parks and green spaces “support human health and wellness.” It is a well-known fact that San Antonio has a large number of residents suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes, heart disease, and respiratory problems. Parks, Dr. Wolf argues, are “particularly relevant” if they offer “walking and bike paths, and playing fields.”

Urban parks have many health benefits for those who use them on a regular basis. Studies show that individuals who frequent parks can reduce the risk of various health conditions, such as high blood pressure and cardiovascular disease. Open green spaces have also been associated with positive mental health. A recent study found that “people who spent at least two hours in nature per week were consistently more likely to report higher levels of health and well-being compared to people who spent less time in nature.”

Today Brackenridge Park is suffering from long-deferred maintenance. The neglect is painful to observe. With the upcoming Bond elections, residents of San Antonio have an opportunity to support the badly needed maintenance and expansion of the popular Brackenridge Park amenities. 

Erick Walsh, Councilman Manny Palaez, Airport Director Jesus Saenz and San Antonio’s premier Chef Johnny Hernandez among others.


