

On Monday, May 2, 2022, Politico published a draft of a Supreme Court opinion that would overturn Roe v. 

The Texas Legislative Black Caucus Condemns East Bernard ISD's Hair Policy

The Texas Legislative Black Caucus (TxLBC) is aware of the situation where high school junior, Dyree Williams, was not allowed to enroll into East Bernard High School in East Bernard, TX, because his braided hair did not comply with the school district's dress code policy. The high school's Student Code of Conduct, which has since been removed from their website, states that "[b]raided hair or corn rows will not be allowed."

State Representative Nicole Collier, Chair of the TxLBC had this to say, "East Bernard High School's policy banning the wearing of corn rows or braids serves as a means to justify discrimination based on one's race and gender. The way one wears their hair is a personal choice and those policies in our public schools that prohibit natural hairstyles such as cornrows, braids or even dreadlocks do not reflect the rich diversity of Texas. This is a growing problem in Texas and it distracts from the real work that needs to be done in our schools."

State Representative Rhetta Bowers, Secretary of TxLBC and the author of the CROWN Act in the 87th Regular Session said, "it is situations like this that inspired the creation of the CROWN Act, and emphasize the need for it to be passed in Texas. There is no reason why a student's natural hairstyle should hinder their ability to receive a quality education within the Texas public school system."

State Senator Royce West, member of TxLBC and the Texas Senate Committee on Education said, "Texas public school policies must be fair and inclusive for all of Texas' students. Students depend on our educational system for the tools and resources necessary for their educational success and growth as citizens. Is it not the role of educational leaders to deny a student access to the culmination of their educational journey because of their natural hair preference. Discrimination can worm its way into education policy and therefore, we must continuously do the work to root out discrimination and bias in our

educational system, so that we can give our future leaders a fighting chance at success."

The Texas Legislative Black Caucus is Chaired by State Representative Nicole Collier, (D-Fort Worth), and was formed in 1973 with eight founding members. Today, the TxLBC is a bipartisan, bicameral organization composed of 17 Members of the Texas House and two Senators in the Texas Senate. The combined constituent population for the members of the TxLBC is over four million Texans.

Mural Reflecting on Refugee and Immigrant Women Finds New Home at Pre-K for SA West Campus

The City of San Antonio's Department of Arts & Culture announced today that a mural that previously was housed in the heart of downtown has found a new home at the Pre-K 4 SA - West Education Center at 1235 Enrique M. Barrera Pkwy. Interwoven, by San Antonio Artist Jennifer Khoshbin, will now permanently greet

students and caregivers as they arrive to the campus.

"It is an honor to have Interwoven installed at the Pre-K 4 SA West Education Center," Pre-K 4 SA CEO Sarah Baray said. "At Pre-K 4 SA, we integrate arts and civic engagement into our curriculum. The meaning behind this work of art reiterates to

our children that whether they were born in San Antonio or came here from another place, they are important members of our community. It reminds us to embrace the tapestry of cultures that make San Antonio a vibrant city."

The mural depicts five refugee and immigrant women from Afghanistan, Turkey, Honduras, Democratic

Republic of Congo and Haiti and are envisioned as working as seamstresses who now reside in San Antonio. The colorful portraits highlight the culture of each woman through her clothing style and patterns, while the new tree growth mirrors her new life in San Antonio. In addition to the mural, Khoshbin collaborated with seamstresses to create a series of nylon flags featuring an expression of their culture through textile art.

"When I created this, it was my goal to express support and fellowship to the different cultures that are now part of the larger San Antonio community, especially those that might not have a powerful presence or voice in the community," said Khoshbin. "Now that Interwoven is part of an education center, I hope it

questions about the world around them and celebrate the different cultures that create the fabric of our city."

The mural was originally temporarily installed in December 2018 at the Houston St. Garage as part of Tricentennial celebrations. It was de-installed in August of 2020 as that space is allotted for rotating artworks.

"Taking Interwoven out of storage and permanently installing it onto the façade of Pre-K for SA was a delight for our Public Art Team," said Interim Executive Director Krystal Jones. "We hope this mural will help guide these young learners and the community to open the heart and mind to possibilities and fuel the imagination."

Fidencio Duran: A Painter Who Captures Latino Culture and Traditions in Everyday Life

By Ricardo Romo, Ph.D Texas artist Fidencio Duran has been climbing tall scaffolds since he won a commission to complete a mural in Brownsville, Texas thirty-seven years ago. Today, Duran's murals are among the most visible for any Latino artist in America. On an annual basis millions see his colorful mural, "The Visit," above the American,

Continental, and United Airlines ticket counters at the Austin International Airport. City of Austin officials predict that 20 million travelers will walk through the airport corridors in 2022. Such visibility is making Latino art important to the American art scene.

Duran's murals in East Austin are well known for providing a visual historical narrative of Texas-Mexicans or Tejanos. Tejano is a term popular

among many Latinos of Mexican background living in Texas. In his community murals, Duran traces the historical path of Tejanos and Indigenous people over the past three centuries. His most visible East Austin murals are at Montopolis Recreational and Community Center, the Holly Street Power Plant, and the El Centro Campus of the Austin Community College. He is also featured as a muralist at the Dell Children's Medical Center and Dell/Seton Hospital at UT Austin.

Duran grew up in Lockhart, an old ranching

community 30 miles south of Austin. The town is particularly noted for its great Texas barbecue. In 1999 the Texas Legislature proclaimed Lockhart as the "Barbecue Capital of Texas." During Duran's early school years, Lockhart, with a population of fewer than ten thousand residents, qualified as a small rural town. The community had one high school where Latinos constituted an estimated one-fourth of the student body.

Lockhart was surrounded by cattle ranches and agricultural farms for much of the 20th century. The rural characteristics of the region and the people living there are captured in many of Duran's murals and paintings. Many of his subjects are inspired by the stories his father told him about immigrating from Mexico and "living and working as a tenant farmer." Duran wrote in his Artist

Statement that he seeks to "honor the history of his family and community in visual stories."

Duran's first school prize was actually in writing. In the sixth grade, he won first place in a University Interscholastic League competition for an essay that asked the young students to write about whom they most admired. He chose to write about his dad, who worked as a janitor at the school he attended.

Early on, art teachers set high expectations for Duran recognizing his high motivation to learn coupled with his gifted artistic abilities. His teachers also made sure the young art student benefited from seeing the work of great artists. His teachers organized field trips to Dallas and the University of Texas Austin art museums.

In high school, Duran had the good fortune of meeting Ricardo Hernandez, an Austin artist who befriended him and served as a mentor during his early years. Hernadez, a University of Texas at El Paso [UTEP] graduate, recommended the border city campus to Duran. Enrolling at UTEP in the fall of 1979, Duran fell in love with his art classes. He studied with Dr. Robert Massey who provided superb instruction in drawing, composition, and perspective. Duran learned the elements of design, a skill that would serve him well in later years in mural painting.

Duran returned to Austin after two years in El Paso and graduated in 1984 with a degree in Fine Arts from the University of Texas. The following year Duran received funding from the Texas Commission of the Arts to paint a mural in Brownsville, Texas, a border city near the Gulf of Mexico. The Commission designated La Esperanza, a home for girls, for the mural.

Upon finishing the Brownsville mural, Duran returned to Austin to discover the many challenges of making a living as an



artist. He lacked important connections to art galleries and knew little about going about acquiring representation by an agent or gallery. As a result, Duran worked for two years as a line cook at a local Mexican restaurant, painting on his days off.

By 1990 Duran had quit his day job and returned to painting full time. He exhibited across the state and was represented at different times by El Paso, Austin, and Houston galleries. In the late 1990s, he completed his "Cinco de Mayo" mural at the Zaragoza Recreation Center in East Austin. Over the next decade, he participated in exhibits in Chicago; Washington, DC; San Francisco; Buenos Aires, Argentina; and Saltillo, Mexico.

Duran's large mural at the Austin International Airport is among my favorites. There are nine panels high above the ticket counters occupying an enormous space nine feet high by ninety linear feet long. Among his subjects are a woman watering her garden; two girls playing volleyball; an accordion player flanked by two friends enjoying a fire in an open field; a young man throwing a frisbee to friends; and several men sitting at a table in the backyard playing dominos. In his mural, Duran brings to life ordinary activities, leisure, culture, and traditions of rural Central Texas

While the majority of Du-

ran's murals are located in Austin, residents of Mercedes and Houston also enjoy his murals in their communities. The narrative work he started in the 1980s won him recognition as the prestigious Texas State Parks' Centennial Artist for 2018 awarded by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Commission. Duran continues to paint daily and is valued for highlighting the history and cultural traditions of Tejanos.

You've always loved making me happy. How could I have survived my first heartbreak without you? At the time, I was sure you didn't understand. Looking back, I know you did.



I can still taste the filling you'd leave for us in the pan after putting a lemon meringue pie in the oven. No one can make them like you.

Cub Scout Den Mother, Safety Patrol Mom, PTA, Home Room Mom: You were always ready to help. How could we not be proud? We belonged to you.

My sense of humor, outlook on life, love for children...they all come from you.

You've always taught me to give back and to put things in God's hands through prayer and faith.

Mom, you've always been there for me and I am so grateful.

Thank you for all you've help me to become. Thank you for giving me your heart and your smile. May I wear them as bravely as you have. God bless you, Mom. I love you. Happy Mother's Day!

Priest in Crisis Battles Multiple Demons in The Empty Confessional

Gabe Russell chose to devote his life to the Catholic church, but when the newly minted priest discovers pedophilia within its ranks, he unleashes his own form of retribution in the gripping new book from Tom Hogan, The Empty Confessional. Hogan, a Catholic seminary refugee and professor of religion, writes with the acumen of someone who has been on the inside of an institution capable of turning a blind eye to heinous acts.

The Empty Confessional plunges readers into the dark workings of the Catholic church and its tacit policy of protecting pedophilic priests as told through the eyes of Gabe, who, at just 27 years old, already has his own parish in workingclass Pittsburgh. But he is in crisis. He is sexually attracted to Michelle, a teacher at the seminary where he works, and he is growing increasingly frustrated by the church's lack of ownership of the pedophilic priests

within its own diocese. Skilled in Krav Maga, a

violent Israeli form of selfdefense, Gabe can easily disable — and kill — with his bare hands. And as Gabe hears confessions from battered and raped women, he decides he can no longer just sit and listen. As he targets the attackers one by one, his taste for violent retribution escalates, and he eventually turns his attention to the pedophilic priests in surrounding parishes.

Enter Carla Jessup, a jaded detective assigned to investigate the attacks. Carla turns to Gabe for his insights on the church and the pedophilia within its ranks, unaware that he is the actual assailant.

When a shocking truth is revealed, Gabe takes his vigilantism too far. Meanwhile, Carla has put the pieces together, and she is ready to confront Gabe.

In the final scene, readers are treated to a brilliant kabuki dance, with Carla visiting Gabe as he is hearing confessions, but neither one acknowledges the other by name. Will Gabe answer to his crimes? Or will his secrets be protected by the seal of the confessional?






